This course is intended to guide undergraduate students from all disciplines through the stages of writing their undergraduate theses.

- Topics include planning, research and documentation, prose style and editing, document design, ethics, abstracts, and oral presentations.
- Because the course will enroll from different disciplines, students will also become acquainted with research topics, ways of framing arguments, and making points outside their fields of study, which will help them develop a more interdisciplinary perspective.

Leave plenty of time to obtain permission to register!
Class meeting day/time will be determined based on the Phase I schedules of those students obtaining a permit for the class before/during Phase I.

This course has several prerequisites. Students must have permission to register from the Undergraduate Research Opportunities Program (UROP).

- 1) your full name, student id #, major, & faculty mentor's name
- 2) a list of semesters you have conducted research (include course #s and Spring 2008 courses to be taken)
- 3) a proposal of the research that will form the basis of the thesis you will write in the class (see requirements at: <http://undergradresearch.gatech.edu/documents/RO-proposal-content.pdf>)

AND

- 4) have your faculty research advisor and department email Dr. Harwell his/her approval of your thesis research topic and certify that you are ready to take the course.
