1. (9 points)

For each of the following vocabulary terms, write a concise 1-2 sentence definition. Be brief, and to the point.

- (a) [3 pts] clone

Solution: In python, the operation of making a complete copy of some data item, such as a picture or a list. This allows you to modify the clone without affecting the original.

- (b) [3 pts] file

Solution: A named entity, usually stored on a hard drive, USB drive, or CD-ROM, that contains a stream of characters or bytes.

- (c) [3 pts] proprioception

Solution: Sensors that detect internal state. On your scribbler, stall, time and battery voltage are examples of internal sensors. For you, proprioception allows you to know the relative position of parts of your body, which allows you to do things like touch your nose with your eyes closed.

2. (6 points)

For each kind of sort named in the table below, choose the correct process when sorting the list [3,1,4,2]. Write the letter associated with the correct process in the table. (Only 3 of the available choices will be used.) Also, write the Big O time Complexity class of each sort in the table.

 C. [3,1,4,2] ---> [1,3,4,2] ---> [1,3,2,4] ---> [1,2,3,4]
 D. [3,1,4,2] ---> [3,1][4,2] ---> [3][1][4][2] ---> [1,3][2,4] ---> [1,2,3,4]
 E. [3,1,4,2] ---> [1,3,4,2] ---> [1,3,4,2] ---> [1,3,2,4] ---> [1,3,2,4] ---> [1,2,3,4]

Solution:

Merge Sort: Process D $O(N \log N)$

Bubble Sort: Process E, $O(N^2)$

Insertion Sort: Process A, $O(N^2)$

Grading: +1 for each correct answer.

3. (10 points)

The function below accepts a file name (as a string) and writes every line in that file that begins with a capital letter A to a new file named newFile.txt.

Fill in the blanks appropriately:

    inF.close()

Solution:

```
def onlyAs(filename):
    inF = open( filename, "r")
    outF = open( "newFile.txt", "w")

    lines = inF.readlines()
    for line in lines:
        if line[0] == "A": #or line.startswith("A")
            outF.write(line)

    inF.close()
    outF.close()
```

Grading: 1 point for each correctly filled in blank, with the exception of the if conditional. They get +2 points if that one is correct, +1 if it is close to correct.

4. (6 points)

For each of the following lines, write what it would return when evaluated:

(a) [2 pts] `map(lambda x: x*2, (1,2,3,4))`

Solution: [2,4,6,8] +1 for the numbers, +1 if in a list.

(b) [2 pts] `filter(lambda x: x%3 == 1, range(5))`

Solution: [1,4] +1 for each number, -1 if they forget the list.

(c) [2 pts] `reduce(lambda x,y: x**y, range(5))`

Solution: 0 (zero raised to any power is zero.) +2 for the correct answer.

5. (4 points)

What will this function do to the picture that is passed into it?

```
def mysteryFunc(pic):  
    for pixel in getPixels(pic):  
        average = (getRed(pixel) + getGreen(pixel) + getBlue(pixel)) / 3  
        setRed(pixel, average)  
        setGreen(pixel, average)  
        setBlue(pixel, average)
```

Solution: This function will convert the image to grayscale. (Sets the red/green/blue colors to their average value.)

Grading:

+4 clearly understands what the function does. (convert to grayscale)

+3 correctly describes in detail what the code does.

+1 understands some of what the code does.

6. (15 points)

Write a function named `colorBlock` that accepts a picture as a parameter. Conceptually, divide the picture into three columns of almost equal size. (being off by 1 or 2 pixels is OK if the width of the picture is not an even multiple of 3...)

Set the red value of all pixels in the first column to 255. Set the green value of all pixels in the middle column to 255. Set the blue value of all the pixels in the last column to 255.

Your method should return `None`.

Some functions that might be helpful for this question:

- `getPixels(picture)`
- `getPixel(picture, x, y)`
- `getWidth(picture)`
- `getHeight(picture)`
- `getX(pixel)`
- `getY(pixel)`
- `getRed(pixel)`
- `setRed(pixel, value)`

Solution:

```
def colorBlock(aPic):
    picWidth = getWidth(aPic)

    for pix in getPixels(aPic):
        x = getX(pix)
        if x < picWidth/3:
            setRed(pix,255)

        if x > picWidth/3 and x < 2*picWidth/3 :
            setGreen(pix,255)

        if x > 2*picWidth/3:
            setBlue(pix,255)
```

Grading: +1 for correct header

+2 for getting the width of the picture

+2 for calculating the two boundry areas ($\text{width}/3$ and $2*\text{width}/3$) +9 Coloring each area correctly: On each of the 3: +2 for the correct test, and +1 for the correct color.

+1 if they correctly return `None` (deliberately, or by default)

7. (20 points)

Write a function named `topStudent` that accepts the name of a file to open as a string parameter. The file contains a list of student names and their course grade (as a percentage between 0 and 100, which will always be an integer value) in physics I at Georgia Tech. The `topStudent` function should return the name of the person with the highest course grade. If more than one students have the same highest grade, you may return the name of any student who shares the same high grade. The list of students is unsorted. Each student name is listed on one line with his/her associated average separated by a comma. Example file contents below:

```
Sally Smith, 44
Albert Johnston, 20
David Jones, 55
Sam Walker, 12
Ashley Garcia, 34
Tara Hayes, 60
```

Solution:

```
def topStudent(fname):
    fIn = open(fname, "r")
    lines = fIn.readlines()
    fIn.close()

    topStudent = None
    topGrade = -1

    for sLine in lines:
        data = sLine.split(",")
        name = data[0]
        gradeStr = data[1]
        gradeInt = int(gradeStr)

        if gradeInt > topGrade:
            topGrade = gradeInt
            topStudent = name

    return topStudent
```

Grading:

1 point for correct header
2 points for opening file in read mode.

3 points for reading everything from the file (one read, or readline() in a loop, or readlines()).

4 points for processing each line and separating out the name and the grade

2 points for converting the grade to an INT for comparison ("13" is not less than "100")

5 points for identifying the largest grade.

2 points for identifying the corresponding student name.

1 points for returning the correct student name.
