Assume the following function is defined and then executed:

```
def testFunc(aNum, aStr):
    while True:
        aNum = aNum + 1
        if aNum % 2 == 1:
            print aNum
        if aStr[0] == "y":
            return aNum
        else:
            aStr = aStr[1:]
        print "Loop Running"

aVar = testFunc(5, "vwxyz")
```

What value is stored in aVar?

What does the program PRINT when executed?

5. (4 points)

Assume the following function has been defined and executed as follows:

```
def copyPart(fileName):
    f = open(fileName, "r")
    out = open("output.txt", "w")
    data = f.readline()
    aList = []
    while data != "":
        if not (data in aList):
            out.write(data)
            aList.append(data)
        data = f.readline()
    out.close()
    f.close()
```

If the contents of infile.txt are the following lines:

```
pineapple
eggs
batteries
milk
eggs
cereal
pineapple
milk
juice
milk
```

Write below the contents of the output.txt file:

6. (10 points)

Write a function named **seekLight** that accepts an integer as a parameter. The integer corresponds to how long your function should run, in seconds, before returning.

While running, your function should get the value of the robots' center light sensor (using a getLight('center') call). If the value returned is smaller than 500, your robot should move forward at full speed for one second. If the light sensor value is larger than (or equal to) 500, the robot should beep at 800Hz for 1 second, and not move.

Make sure that, no matter what, your robot stops and the function returns when the time is up! You may assume that the myro library is already loaded and that your robot is already connected (init has been called) to the computer.

When your function returns, it should return None.

7. (9 points)

Stick Together - Write a function called **stickTogether** that accepts a list as a parameter. It should return a string that is the concatenation of all string elements in the list. Note that non-string elements should be skipped, including nested lists.

For example:

```
>>> result = stickTogether( [ 4, "Hello", ["bob",3], " ", True, "There!", 7] )
>>> print result
  "Hello There!"
```

8. (10 points)

Create a function named charMap that accepts a string as a parameter. Your function should create a dictionary that has each unique character in the string as a key. The value associated with the key will be a tuple that contains all of the (integer) positions (indices) in the string where that character occurs. Your function should return this dictionary after creating it.

Example output:

```
>>> result = charMap("Hello World")
>>> print result
{' ': (5,), 'e': (1,), 'd': (10,), 'H': (0,), 'l': (2, 3, 9), 'o': (4, 7),
    'r': (8,), 'W': (6,)}
```
